LATEX's standard styles use two page styles, one on normal pages and one on 'opening' pages with \maketitle or \chapter etc. Unfortunately there is only easy access to changing one of these two so if you want something other than 'plain' on the opening pages you must use \thispagestyle{...} on *each* such page.

The fancyheadings package does provide a more flexible interface, but if you just want an empty page style on all pages then

```
\usepackage{nopageno}
```

will do the job.
